## File Folder Book Report Directions

### Front Cover

Design a "Movie Poster" that represents your book. You can choose one of the most exciting and interesting scenes or feature the main characters from the book. Include a "Rotten Tomatoes" review somewhere on the poster. Make sure to include the title of the book and the author's name. It should be neat, creative and attractive.

### Summary

Think of the most important parts of the story. Write a summary that includes the main characters, the setting, the problem, important events in the plot and how the story all comes to an end. Summary shows be 5 paragraphs.

### **Book Critique**

Everyone always says, "Don't judge a book by it's cover." Now it's your chance to be the judge. Give your novel an overall rating. Is it a five star read or were you unimpressed? Do you recommend this book to a friend or should they avoid it? Either way, give your critique of the book. Persuade your friends to give it a read or not. Book Critique should be 2 paragraphs explaining why you liked the book, or why you didn't.

Theme

The theme of a story is the message the author sends to the reader. What was the theme of your novel? What evidence can you include to prove this was the theme? Remember one piece of evidence would not be enough to explain the theme. Theme should be I paragraph.









